


# THE SCRAPPY CORNERS QUILT






# **#TheScrappyCornersQuilt**

Small throw and Large throw sizes

The Scrappy Corners quilt is a simple scrap stash friendly quilt pattern. Cut squares from your scrap stash and start sewing!



## **MATERIALS**

6.5 inch unfinished

#### SMALL THROW 80 blocks - 48" x 60"

Scrappy corners - x160 - 2.5" squares Background fabric - 2 5/8 yards Binding - 1/2 yard or (6) 2.5 inch strips Backing: 3 1/8 yards

#### LARGE THROW 120 blocks - 60" x 72"

Scrappy corners - x240 - 2.5" squares Background fabric - 3 3/4 yards Binding - 1/2 yard or (7) 2.5 inch strips Backing: 3 7/8 yards

### **CUTTING**

#### **SCRAPPY CORNERS:**

Cut 2.5 inch squares from your scrap stash. Small throw – x160, large throw – x240.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

**Small throw:** Cut (14) 6.5 inch x WOF strips. From these strips cut (80) 6.5 inch squares.

**Large throw:** Cut (20) 6.5 inch x WOF strips. From these strips cut (120) 6.5 inch squares.

#### **KEEP IT SCRAPPY!**


Use low volume scraps as the background pieces.


### **QUILT BLOCK ASSEMBLY**


Mark a diagonal line on the back of each 2.5 inch scrappy square.


Place right sides together in opposite corners of each background square. Sew on the marked line. Trim corner off 1/4 inch past the sewn line. Press corners open.

**NOTE:** Press the corners in the same direction for each block so they nest in the quilt top assembly stage. Usually snowball corners get pressed up but I recommend pressing one side a little unconventionally like this for nested seams.









## **QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY**

Assemble the quilt top in rows **rotating** each block so the seams nest. This will really help keep nice and sharp points.

Start the quilt top layout with the snowball corner in the top left position.


Press each row in opposite directions to nest the seams.


Small throw: 8 rows x 10 columns

Large throw: 10 rows x 12 columns

# **ALTERNATE VERSION**


You can also make a bow tie quilt by not rotating the blocks. No need to press corners in the same direction for this version.

# **FINISH YOUR QUILT!**

- Piece together backing fabric and press seams.
- · Make a quilt sandwich by layering backing wrong side up, batting and quilt top right side up.
- · Baste and quilt as desired.
- Square up quilt and bind using binding strips. Machine binding tutorial: http://www.quiltylove.com/machine-bind-quilt-beginner-friendly-method/




# **COLOR SCHEME**


My version of The Scrappy Corners quilt uses primarily pinks, purply-pinks and oranges. Mustard and aqua colors are added as an accent.


#### **MAIN COLORS**
